

## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

**Abstracts that cannot be published in UMJ will not be considered for presentation.**

**“Not for publication” abstracts will not be accepted.**

**Please state in your e-mail submission that the abstract is eligible for publication.**

1. Abstracts must be typed in WORD using single spacing of not less than 10-point font size preferably in Times Roman font and sent as an attachment.
2. The text of an abstract (excluding title, authors, references) must not exceed 250 words including one table if appropriate. Figures are not allowed.
3. The author's initials only and surname, without degree etc., should appear below title. If it is necessary to identify institution of authors where more than one institution is involved use numbered superscript after author's name. For example:

The lymphatic system is wonderful. JA Smith<sup>1</sup>, DG Jones<sup>2</sup>, Departments of Endocrinology<sup>1</sup> and Lymphatology<sup>2</sup>, Belfast HSC Trust, Belfast, UK.

4. The address (Department, Institution, Town) should be listed next (see example above).
5. The text of the abstract must include data with clear description of results and conclusions. Headings within the text are not allowed. Capital letters are not to be used to describe special terms, procedures etc., and may only be used where appropriate (at the start of sentences, where proper nouns are involved, with abbreviations). All abbreviations must be clearly defined. Statistical methods must be clearly indicated. Up to two references may be included, in the Vancouver style i.e. number in the text and listed after the text in the following format:-

Allen JM, Keenan AK, McHale NG. Lymphatic function in cardiovascular disease. *N Engl J Med* 1999;**123(4)**:10-14.

Davis GK, Mertz O. *Transition metals in nutrition*. In: Trace elements in nutrition (4<sup>th</sup> edition). Ed O Mertz. Academic Press, San Diego 1998; 123-123.

6. Abstracts are submitted on the understanding that they will be subject to editorial approval and submission does not guarantee publication.
7. You should send the abstract electronically to: [john.purvis@westerntrust.hscni.net](mailto:john.purvis@westerntrust.hscni.net) To facilitate rapid filing, please ensure that ABSTRACT USIM is typed in the subject box of your email.

It would be helpful if the abstract is sent from the e-mail address to which further correspondence is to be sent. If this is not the case, please make clear the alternative e-mail address. It is also assumed that one of the authors of the abstract will be available to present the paper on the day of the USIM meeting.

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
